Scenarios will will incorporate problem solving and an opportunity to practice practical survival skills and techniques in a realistic environment. Learning will be supported by experienced physicians and wilderness medicine providers. Emphasis will be placed on the principles of situational awareness, communication, and risk assessment.

### Excellent or Excrement: Guide to Sorting Out Research Claims
